

How to bring fun, amazement, and learning to your students with James Warren's

Virtual School Assemblies!

(Recommended for grades 3 through 12.)

Both students and teachers need a breath of fresh air in these restricted times, and James' **Magic With A Message Virtual Assembly** is a great way to raise everyone's spirit. Here I want to answer a few questions you may have about how it works in the virtual medium.

HOW DO WE STAGE A VIRTUAL ASSEMBLY?

The photo above shows students gathering for James' virtual assembly. They wore masks and were seated at socially-distanced desks. Two large screen TV's at the front of the classroom served as my stage.

Because of the flexibility of the virtual environment, a teacher can schedule an assembly for an **individual classroom** (which will allow more interaction with individual students, and give everyone a closer view).


Or you can schedule an assembly for the **entire school** and have students watching in all classrooms at the same time.

Or can have the assembly for **specific grades only**. The school pictured above, for example, needed a show just for their sixth graders.

As you see in the photo above, students can also participate from the safety of their own homes. Just give them the Zoom link and password. If your school uses a platform other than Zoom, such as Google Meets, no problem – just email everyone the appropriate link and instructions for getting into the “meeting.”



James works with a teacher to prepare an assembly in a school auditorium.

Another way to stage the assembly is in an auditorium, streaming the performance through an LCD projector. Kids sit appropriately distanced, and the show is projected onto a large screen (usually a built-in screen that pulls-down on the stage).

DOES YOUR VIRTUAL SHOW ALLOW FOR AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION?

Absolutely! This is NOT a recording, but a LIVE performance. I can see the students and call upon individuals to stand up, approach the screen, and participate. For kids used to interacting with electronic devices and screens, this is as effective as my being there in person!

DOES THE PRICING CHANGE FOR VIRTUAL ASSEMBLIES?

Pricing is the same, with one HUGE exception. You'll save on any travel and lodging expenses that I would have added to the fee if making an in-person visit to your school – and that usually saves most schools anywhere from \$100 to \$500.
